Through effective communication, instruction, coaching and encouragement, the Provincial Team Coach supports the strategic objectives of WSWS and assists athletes in realizing their potential.

#### **POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Setting goals with athletes, development of program plan, including post season follow up.
- Teaching relevant skills and techniques to team athletes according to their level of ability.
- Monitoring and enhancing performance by providing guidance, encouragement and constructive feedback.
- Identifying strengths and weaknesses of team athletes.
- Supporting team athletes during major Canadian competitions by organizing familiarization, hosting team meetings, communicating with each athlete and their family, educating newer athletes on tournament format, pinning athletes, and answering any questions. The provincial coach is expected to be the SK representative at the Nationals meeting.
- Coordinate and collaborate with other coaches such as technical coaches brought in to compliment the programming.
- Mentoring and developing young coaches, encouraging them to "shadow" your coaching in the boat and supervising and giving feedback of their coaching practices.
- Communicating with the WSWS board, parents and families.
- Undertaking administrative tasks such as athlete training schedule, coordination of sport science sessions.
- Be present for sport science sessions with athletes.
- Deliver officiating courses as needed.
- Assisting the local clubs with technical requirements and up to standards for tournaments.
- Assisting WSWS with waterski sport promotion and development such as tournaments and social media.
- Following all towed sport safety protocols.
